We are pleased to learn that the Broads Authority has successfully negotiated leases on two new BA24-hour free moorings, at Aldeby Hall (on the Waveney) and Hardley Mill (on the Yare); both are due to open in 2025.

Warning: temporary closures take place for repiling, dredging and flood alleviation work.

Persons in charge of boats are reminded not to cause nuisance at moorings. (Under byelaw 84 it is an offence to allow your vessel to emit smoke or fumes or make noise or nuisance which give reasonable grounds for annoyance to any other person.)

Please remember that at the more tidal moorings (anywhere on the Yare, or Waveney, and downstream of Acle on the Bure), you need to take account of tidal conditions and the river bank and bed profiles to ensure the safety of your boat. Not an issue if you are mooring up for half an hour, but if mooring overnight, check that your boat will still be afloat at Low Water.
