A little background to the Acle Regatta and Great Yarmouth Yacht Club

The Great Yarmouth Yacht Club was formed in 1883. In 1890 it launched the ***Acle Regatta*** which attracted over 150 sailing craft with professional crews and ran it until 1937.

In 1897, to mark Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee, the club purchased, through subscriptions from members and friends, a large decorative silver gilt cup to be known as ***The Diamond Jubilee Gold Challenge Cup***. Early races were held annually on Breydon Water.

In July 1937 Wroxham Broad became available for lease and in 1938 four clubs merged, including the Great Yarmouth Yacht Club, to form the Norfolk Broads Yacht Club, and Acle Regatta was scrapped.

The Diamond Jubilee Gold Challenge Cup, however, continues to be hard fought for by Broads, Waveney, Yare & Bure and Yarmouth One Designs, and has become the highlight of Norfolk Broads Yacht Club's Wroxham Week.

In 1978 ***Acle Regatta*** was revived by five local men who started Acle Sailing Club, raising thousands of pounds over 46 years for charity.

In 2014 Great Yarmouth businessman and sailor Mark Duffield thought that each coastal town with a maritime history should have its own yacht club. With family and friends he set about re-establishing Great Yarmouth Yacht Club by applying some of the traditions of the original club without undue formality.



Ten years later, nearly nine decades after it last ran it, Great Yarmouth Yacht Club was approached to again take over the running of ***Acle Regatta***.

It rose to the challenge and has restored the racing programme of yesteryear by offering races for not only river cruisers, but also half deckers and dinghies. It continues to present the Acle Sailing Club trophies, and the tradition of donating profits to charity. The two day regatta is held annually on the weekend before the May spring bank holiday.

- 3) Handicaps - Portsmouth Numbers as declared in the Green Book with no adjustment for non-spinnaker use.
- 4) Where points for Challenge Trophies are concerned, ONE discard will be allowed (unless there are only two or less races).
- 5) River Cruisers - these will be downriver races for the Merlin Challenge Cup.
- 6) Separate class races may be organised if 5 or more boats enter, at the discretion of the OOD.
- 7) Split starts will be granted if the number of entries and the weather conditions merit such consideration.
- 8) All boats must have adequate insurance against third party liability (minimum cover £2,000,000).

BUOYANCY AIDS The wearing of adequate personal buoyancy by all dinghy sailors is compulsory (a wetsuit does not constitute adequate buoyancy), and keelboats and cruisers must carry an adequate number of buoyancy aids compatible with the number of crew on board and worn if Y flag is flown.
